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The Executive Secretaries will meet early December to prepare a paper for the Political Bureau in January 09 regarding the results and the process of recruiting a new General Secretary. In March 09 Xavier Gizard will retire and a new General Secretary will be approved at the GA on Gothenburg.

Members from NSC would like an early information on big issues to have time to discuss before decisions are made in CPMR.

3. Elections of NSC Office bearers

5. NSC Finances,

The Executive Secretary commented on the financial status. Before the meeting all members except two had paid their members fee. The finances are under control and NSC will see a small surplus for 2008. This includes the costs of upgrade the website covered by this years budget. 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The paper of 13.10.08 was divided into three categories of action;

- Category 1: Recommendations easily implementable in short term, requiring no or few additional resources.
- Category 2: Recommendations to be implemented on medium term, requiring more preparations and resource allocations than category 1.
- Category 3: Recommendations for longer term, requiring principled policy decisions and resource allocations to be implemented

The suggestion for a Maritime policy pilot project came up at the GA in Herring. The Maritime policy pilot project was supported as an idea but must be worked on more to be more concrete, the Marine Resources group is responsible to make a draft project proposal.

A draft version of the new NSC website was presented.

Decision:

- **The Executive Committee supports the following recommendations in the follow up of the report Promoting the Success of the NSC and the recommendations of 13.10.08 from the Strategic Committee ;**

- *Recommendation 1: Professional marketing experts (internal or external) are identified and commissioned to develop the North Sea Commission brand.*
- *Recommendation 2: Publicity materials, including templates, presentations, banners, leaflets and a newsletter are updated/produced, based on the NSC brand.*
- *Recommendation 3: A members survey of the current website is undertaken to guide the development of the revised NSC website.*
- *Recommendation 4: The NSC brand should be supported through the website through strengthening the homepage and developing separate sections on the outcomes of the consultancy exercise and a link to the NSC corporate presentation.*
- *Recommendation 5: A section of profiles on NSC Executive Committee members, Thematic Groups Chairs, Vice-Chairs and Advisers is included in the revised website.*
- *Recommendation 6: The structure of NSC meetings should be examined to identify means of incorporating networking sessions with local Politicians, groups and media contacts in the hosting regions.*
- *Recommendation 7: A North Sea Commission Communications Strategy, setting out protocols for publicising the organisation, is developed.*

In addition;

- *Joint organisation of thematic meetings in conjunction with Executive meetings (only Chairs, Vice-Chairs and Advisers)*
- *All thematic groups meet on the Tuesday before the Annual Conference starts at the venue for the conference (all group members)*
- *Organise Road shows in selected (non- or less active) regions to promote the work of the NSC*
- *Assign national members of the Executive with specific responsibilities for:*
 - *Reporting regularly to Ex Com and General Assembly about NSC-relevant developments in their respective countries*
 - *Building awareness of the NSC and strengthen relations with the national*
 - *Leading ad hoc-groups and coordinating various investigations and studies, for instance on organisational matters*
- *Seeking discussions with the INTERREG IVB North Sea Programme Secretariat on ways of strengthening the links between the NSC and the Programme.*



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- *Arrange a meeting with the NSP Secretariat to agree on common priorities and operational “modalities”*

- ***The Executive Committee asks the thematic groups for input before making decisions on the Category 2 actions.***
- ***The Executive Committee supports the Maritime Policy Pilot Project and ask the Marine Resources group to follow up the project idea.***
- ***The update on the Maritime Week 09 is for information. NSC will nominate one representative to Chair one of the sessions.***
- ***NSC supports the Maritime Week financially with maximum 4000 £***
- ***The work for updating the NSC website was for information***

7. NSC GA 09

The 18th General Assembly will be in Noord-Holland in 23rd. to 26th June 2009. This will be a joint conference with the Interreg North sea programme using the same setup as for GA 08 in Herning. Commissioner Borg is invited to speak at the conference Thursday.

The Executive Committee discussed the idea of joint meetings for the thematic groups in connection with the GA and supported the idea of inviting all groups to hold a meeting on the 23 June as one of the group's regular meetings. This to save costs and time for members to travel to NSC meetings.

Decision:

The set up for the GA 09 were approved.

The Executive Committee supports the idea of a joint meeting the day before the GA starts (23 June) for all thematic groups and asks the Adviser s and the Secretariat to prepare this for the GA09.

8. Next meeting

The Executive Committee is invited to Kristiansand in Vest-Agder, Norway late March 09.
